The purpose of the service is to teach people skills necessary to be successful in a job in the community.  Examples of service activities include but are not limited to: following rules, attendance, completing tasks, problem solving, endurance, work speed, work accuracy, increased attention span, motor skills, safety, and social skills in the workplace.

## SPECIAL ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

- A. Individuals who receive services under 20 USC Chapter 3, section 1400 of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) are not eligible for Prevocational Services.
- B. Prevocational Services are for persons who are not expected to be able to get a paid job in the next year.
- C. Approval of services is based on need, the individual's disability and there must be a goal established for the individual related to the service in the Individual Service Plan that is approved by the Regional Office.
- D. Prevocational Services must be approved before services are received, reviewed annually, and when there are any changes to the Individual Service Plan.

## **ITEMS COVERED:**

- 1. Teaching such concepts as rule compliance, attendance, task completion, problem solving, endurance, work speed, work accuracy, increased attention span, motor skills, safety, appropriate social workplace skills and behavior.
- 3. Assistance with personal care and self-administration of medications is also covered but must be included in the Individual Service Plan that is approved by the Regional Office.
- 4. Facility-based training and/or assistance.
- 5. Mobile crews, which consist of a group of individuals who take part in prevocational service activities such as cleaning or landscaping, at community sites at sites outside the facility.
- 6. Transportation to and from the facility site is also included in this service.

## **ITEMS NOT COVERED:**

- 1. Prevocational Services cannot take place at the same time of day as Community Access or Supported Employment services.
- 2. Services that are available under a program funded under section 110 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 or the IDEA (20 U.S.C. 1401 et seq.) are not covered.
- 3. Medically related services that are not allowable by State law, rules, and regulations.
- 4. Prevocational Services cannot take place in the individual's own or family home or any residential site.
- 5. The individual's immediate family cannot provide services without prior approval.
