

# What is TF-CBT?

Trauma-Focused Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) is an evidence-based treatment for children who have experienced sexual abuse or other serious traumatic events. It was developed and tested by Drs. Esther Deblinger, Judy Cohen, and Anthony Mannarino, and has been found in multiple research studies to be an effective treatment for children with trauma-related problems and their families.

#### What is TF-CBT Web?

**TF-CBT** *Web* is a web-based training course for learning Trauma-Focused Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy, sponsored by the Medical University of South Carolina. It covers all of the procedures of TF-CBT, and includes streaming video demonstrations, clinical scripts, cultural considerations, clinical challenges and many other learning resources. **TF-CBT** *Web* is designed to allow you to learn at your own pace, and use the learning experiences when it is convenient for you. Once you have completed **TF-CBT** *Web*, you can return as often as you like to "brush up" on the techniques, watch the demonstrations, download the resources, or learn about upcoming training events.

Material is presented in a concise format designed for busy professionals.

#### Does TF-CBT Web work with any computer?


