# WHAT IS RFW ?

DBHDD contracts with providers throughout the state of Georgia to provide outpatient and residential substance abuse treatment for women. Currently DBHDD has 17 outpatient and 20 residential providers.

## The Ready for Work (RFW) Programs are

designed to eliminate substance abuse as a barrier to employment for pregnant and parenting women, provide an array of services that address risk factors for relapse and that enable consumers to achieve abstinence. maintain ongoing recovery, avoid illegal activity, maintain suitable employment, obtain safe housing following discharge, and meet family roles and responsibilities. The RFW target population is pregnant and parenting women with children under the age of 13 years old with substance abuse disorders. RFW programs also provide services for women who are at high risk for relapse, are sufficiently medically stable to participate in intensive outpatient and residential treatment, and who may have one or more of the following risk factors:

- Pregnant women will be given priority status.
- Highest priority is given to women who meet the needy families definition;
- Women that have had involvement with the criminal justice system
- Women who have a history of relapse; and/or secondary medical or psychiatric disorder that can be safely managed in a substance abuse treatment environment;
- Women with an open child protective service case.

Evidence Based Practices Treatment Modalities and Curriculums are used by gender specific licensed and certified staff to engage the women in the services provided by the RFW programs throughout the state of Georgia. The services listed below are not limited to all services provided by RFW providers.

## **Services Provided**

- Needs Assessment
- Substance Abuse Treatment Groups
- Relapse Prevention
- Trauma Informed Care
- Anger Management
- Healthy Relationships including HIV/AIDS

- Criminal Addictive Thinking
- Co-Occurring Disorder

- Basic life skills that includes but is not limited to self care hygiene and parenting
- Therapeutic Childcare Services
- Assessment of work skills and abilities
- Case management and transportation to ensure that women and their children have access to services provided
- Employment assistance includes job training, job matching, and other supports to allow clients to gain work experience and demonstrate their employability for the competitive job market

## **Questions and Answers:**

- Q. Can my child(ren) stay with me while in residential treatment?
- A. Yes, Children 13 years of age or younger are allowed to stay with the mother while in residential treatment.
- Q. Are there any services for my child(ren)?
- A. Yes, Therapeutic Child Care is available.
- Q. Is there a cost associated with these services ?
- A. All treatment services and housing are provided through state and federal funding.
- Q. When preparing for my initial appointment what should I bring?
- A. Proof of Identification including: Birth Certificate, Social Security Card, and Picture ID.
- Q. Can I attend the Ready For Work Program if I was recently released from prison or jail?
- A. Yes, Ready For Work providers serve women with and without children.
- Q. What is the average length of stay?
- A. The average length of stay is three to six months. Aftercare services are provided to women who have successfully completed a RFW program.
- Q. How do I enroll in treatment services?
