DBHDD UPDATE	COMMISSIONER FRANK BERRY	
Discussion	<ul> <li>Southwestern State Hospital in Thomasville and the Craig Nursing Facility at Central State Hospital are scheduled to close on December 31, 2013.</li> <li>Commissioner Berry recently met with stakeholders and also with Governor Deal to discuss the new community-based alternatives being added in Thomasville, Albany and Valdosta to support individuals after Southwestern State Hospital closes. The CSBs in Region 4 are offering a full array of services which will increase community access.</li> <li>Due to the quality of some providers, needed oversight, and provider capacity, individuals with developmental disabilities (DD) have been the most challenging population to place. DBHDD's self-directed 45-day hold on new transitions has been lifted and community integration has been resumed. DBHDD is requiring competency based training and on-site monitoring before an individual is approved for transition. Commissioner Berry stated that DBHDD is creating partnerships with its providers and taking significant steps to hold providers more accountable.</li> <li>Commissioner Reese asked what will happen if all consumers cannot be placed? Commissioner Berry replied that the facility would be kept open. Risks cannot be taken by prematurely moving individuals for the purpose of meeting a number.</li> <li>Commissioner Owens commented on his recent tour of Central State Hospital and recommended that others should to tour the hospital also. He shared that his visit was impressive.</li> </ul>

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT		COMMISSIONER FRANK BERRY	
DISCUSSION	<ul> <li>The future of Georgia's workforce was an issue that the Council prioritized at its last meeting. The need for a stronger behavioral health workforce is a growing challenge.</li> <li>If the behavioral health workforce issues are not addressed soon, the state runs the risk of not being able to support the services that it offers. CSBs will be greatly impacted by a behavioral health staff shortage.</li> <li>Commissioner Reese suggested that a human resources team is needed to address the concern and that implementation is needed rather than discussion.</li> <li>Ben Robinson of the Board of Regents' Office of Academic Affairs drafted and submitted two proposed solutions to Commissioner Berry that the Executive Committee reviewed. However, the consensus of the Executive Committee was that the Council is not in a position to move in either proposed direction.</li> <li>The Council should hear from other subject matter experts before making a decision.</li> <li>It was suggested that a clear direction be articulated to legislators in the BHCC annual report.</li> </ul>		
Conclusions	<ul> <li>No formal actions were taken on the suggestions. No other business was brought forward.</li> </ul>
