DISCUSSION	Ms. Ryan presented the Statement of Facts on the transference of property at Central State Hospital. The Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities (DBHDD) is asking the State Properties Commission (SPC) to declare three (3) buildings on the Central State Hospital campus in Milledgeville, Georgia as "surplus" for the current and future needs of the Department. The three buildings are: Chapel 3, Jones 286 and Wilkes. DBHDD is working with the SPC to begin the process of leasing the 3 buildings and to grant a one year lease with two potential one-year renewals. The potential leases are: Chapel 3 Building to Outreach Ministry Church; Jones 286 Building to Cogentes Technology LLC; and Wilkes Building to CAPS/ATL (Analytical Training Laboratory). The property will remain in the custody of DBHDD until it is conveyed by quitclaim deed.  Ms. Kimberly Ryan called for a motion. Ms. Susan Radovich made a motion to approve the resolution and the motion was seconded by Mr. Johnny Grant.
Conclusion	The resolution to transfer the property from Central State Hospital was unanimously approved with no further discussion.

## RESOLUTION TRANSFERRING PROPERTY FROM WEST CENTRAL STATE HOSPITAL

located at West Central State Hospital. The State Properties Commission (SPC) requests that the Board accept the quit claim deed associated with the property located at West Central State Hospital. The Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities (DBHDD) approved a Resolution on October 15, 2012, to convey to Columbus Consolidated Government fee simple ownership of parts of acreage for right of improvements, permanent easement for maintenance and slopes, and for temporary construction easement, currently under the custody of West Central Regional Hospital. After the conveyance, the SPC discovered a restrictive covenant on the property. To avoid any breach of the use restrictions, the Columbus Consolidated Government has agreed to quitclaim any

#### FRANK BERRY, COMMISSIONER

#### DISCUSSION

- Update on Regions 4 and 6
  - Commissioner Berry recently spent time with Governor Nathan Deal discussing the Southwestern State Hospital closure and the development of new Crisis Service Centers.
  - The Crisis Service Center in Thomasville will soon be up and running. The Crisis Service Center expansion in Albany is currently underway and the Crisis Service Center in Valdosta is in the ground breaking phase.
  - Region 6 will have a emergency receiving facility.

#### DOJ – End of the year report

o DBHDD is awaiting release of the final report from DOJ.

- The Department's ACT Teams have shown tremendous improvement in quality assurance and have received approval from both the Amici and DOJ.
- DBHDD received a 45-day extension on the placement of individuals with developmental disabilities transitioning from the hospitals so that the Department can continue its focus on assuring quality placements.

#### Budget Update

- Deputy Commissioner Jeff Minor provided an update on DBHDD's budget.
  - Generally each year the budget is due to the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget (OPB) on the 1<sup>st</sup> work day of September.
  - This year, OPB did not request any cuts from DBHDD.
  - DBHDD is being allowed to redirect funds from one line item to another with explanation.
  - In FY 2015, only six (6) agencies are being afforded the opportunity to request more monies and DBHDD is one of those agencies.
  - A special meeting of the Board is needed to approve the AFY 2014 and FY 2015 budget submission requests.
