What is Supported Employment?

- Helps individuals, who otherwise may not be able to work, obtain integrated employment in the community that pays at least minimum wage
- Officially recognized as a service model in the 1980s
- Services consist of:
 - Job development
 - Job coaching
 - Follow-along supports

Current Day and Employment Services Funded by DBHDD

- Community Access Group
 - $\circ~$ Community- and facility-based day services up to 1:10 $\,$
- Community Access Individual

 Community-based activities 1:1
- Pre-Vocational Services
 - $\circ~$ Mobile work crews and sheltered workshops up to 1:10 $\,$
- Supported Employment Individual

 1:1
- Supported Employment Group
 - Enclaves, work crews up to 1:10

- Represents more of a traditional model of supported employment
 - Readiness train, then place
- Newer Models: find job then coach/train on the job
 - Customized employment
 - Discovery

Federal Landscape for Employment and Day Services

- CMS HCBS Settings Rules: focus on community integration and employment for all who want it
- Department of Justice/CMS Settlement Agreements
 o Focus on ADA implications for segregated employment and day services
 o Examples include Oregon, New York, Rhode Island and Virginia
- Vocational Rehabilitation (Department of Labor)
 - New rules excluding segregated services for transitioning youth
 - Requires MOU with education and developmental disability agencies

DBHDD Supported Employment Initiatives

- MOU between Division of Developmental Disabilities and Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency
 - Improves collaboration with VR—blended funding
 - Provides additional VR counselors and benefits navigators
 - Funding to serve transitioning youth
- Developmental Disability Pilot Projects
 - Test new funding model
 - Focus on transitioning youth
 - Use family support funding
