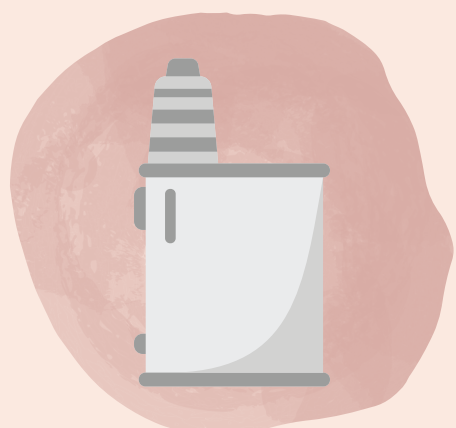


# VAPING AMONG GEORGIA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

YOUTH RISK BEHAVIOR SURVEILLANCE SURVEY, 2019

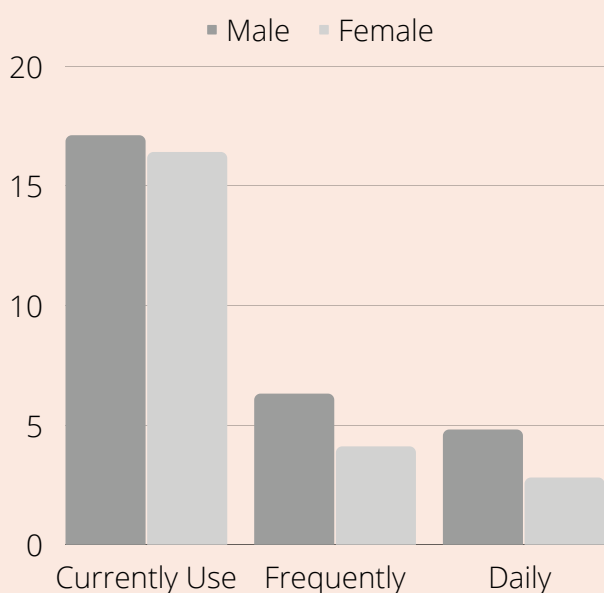
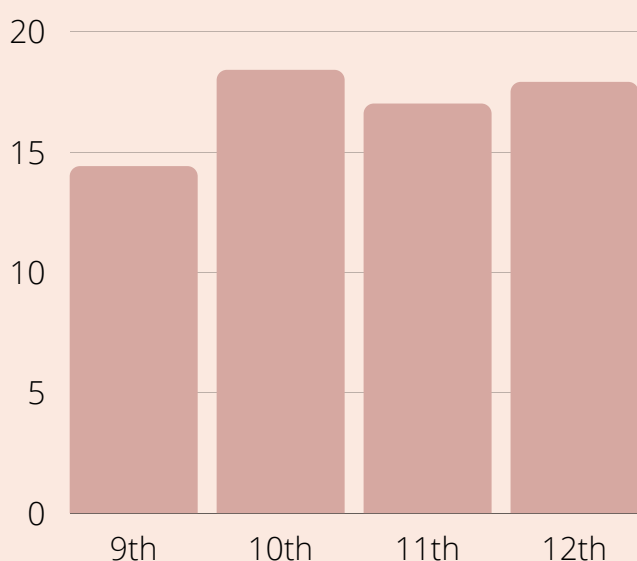


## CURRENT USE BY RACE

Multi-racial students (34.2%) currently use electronic vapor products at the highest rate followed by white students (25.6%) then Hispanic students (15.3%). Black students use electronic vapor products at the lowest rate (2.7%).

## CURRENT USE BY GRADE

Students in 10th grade (18.4%) use electronic vapor products at the highest rate while 9th grade students use at the lowest rate (14.4%).

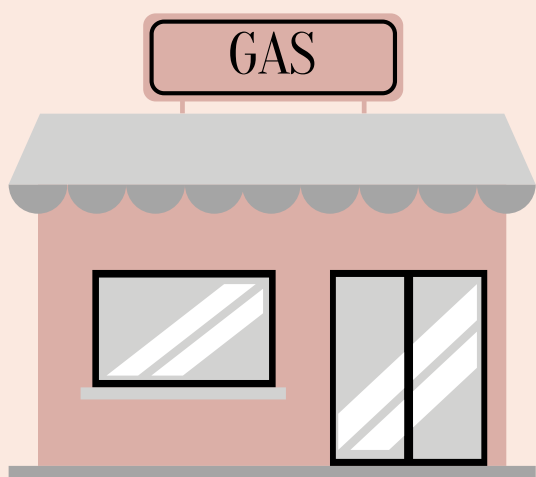


## FREQUENT OR DAILY USE BY SEX

Male high school students are more likely to use an electronic vapor product more frequently (6.3%) or daily (4.8%) than their female peers (4.1% and 2.8%, respectively).

## FREQUENT OR DAILY USE BY RACE OR GRADE

White students use electronic vapor products frequently (10%) or daily (7.1%) at the highest rate compared to students of other races. Students in 12th grade use these products at the highest rates compared to students in younger grades.



## ACCESS TO EVP

Male students (17.4%) buy their electronic vapor products in stores more frequently than their female peers (10.8%). Students in 11th grade (31.2%) buy their products in stores at the highest rate compared to 9th and 10th grade students (3.6% and 6.4%, respectively).
