JAIL DIVERSION TRAUMA RECOVERY (JDTR) CLINICIAN ADMINISTERED PTSD SCALE (CAPS) TRAINING

In order to effectively treat Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), clinicians must be able to accurately diagnose the disorder and determine the symptoms that are present before, during and after treatment. The Clinician Administered PTSD Scale (CAPS) was developed in 1990 to assess current and lifetime diagnoses of PTSD. The CAPS has twenty years of psychometrics that support its use in diagnosis and treatment of PTSD. This 5 ½ hour course is designed to teach clinicians how to administer the clinical interview and how to score it. Didactic information on administering the CAPS will be supplemented with practice conducting the interview and scoring the measure.

Training Objectives:

- Become familiar with the use of the CAPS as a screening tool and as a diagnostic tool for PTSD.
- Become familiar with the items in the CAPS and recognize that items must be presented in a particular manner in order for the assessment to be valid.
- Become familiar with how to use and score the CAPS.
- Identify resources for further learning about how to use the CAPS with fidelity.
