Environment of Care Spotlight

What exactly is the "Environment of Care"?

In a very general sense, the "Environment of Care" is the work area, equipment, and systems at our hospital. Our Environment of Care also includes those we serve, those we work with, those we work for, and all of the things and places we come in contact with during our day. The Joint Commission standards dedicate an entire chapter specifically to the Environment of Care because it is so critical to our daily work. We have various formal plans that address all aspects of our Environment of Care. These include Fire Safety, Security Management, Hazardous Materials, and Medical Equipment. These plans and others address safety issues that often we take for granted as we go through our daily routines.

 For instance, do you know why you are not supposed to block any exit at the hospital, even "just for a minute"? This is a safety issue and can be the difference between successful fire safety and a tragedy on our campus.

Environment of Care Spotlight (continued)

- What should you do if the lights go out on your unit? The lighting is part of a bigger utility system that is part of our environment of care.
 When the lights go out, there is a plan for generator back-up and emergency powers and lighting on each unit and building until power is restored.
- What is your responsibility in maintaining a "safe, functional environment"? The Joint Commission standard EC.02.06.01 EP's (Elements of Performance) say that we as staff are responsible for maintaining a safe and suitable interior space which includes proper lighting, ventilation, temperature, cleanliness, accessible and appropriate furnishings.

During our daily work, it is each person's responsibility to monitor their Environment of Care and report any concerns or issues they might find. We all benefit when our environment is one that promotes a sense of safety and security for all! Be mindful of your surroundings every day and be ready to share with surveyors what steps you have taken to improve your areas. Let's shine the spotlight on West Central's everimproving Environment of Care!!



UNDERSTANDING MENTAL ILLNESS (PART 3)

ANXIETY DISORDERS

Anxiety disorders are a group of mental illnesses that cause people to feel excessively frightened, uneasy or distressed about situations that most people would not experience the same feelings. If left untreated, anxiety disorders can negatively affect a person's personal relationships and their ability to work. In more severe cases, anxiety disorders can affect a person's activities of daily living (ADLs) like shopping, cooking or going outside. Additionally, these disorders can lead to low selfesteem, isolation and substance abuse.

COMMON ANXIETY DISORDERS

- ⇒ **Panic Disorders**, characterized by "panic attacks", resulting in sudden feelings of terror that can occur repeatedly and without warning.
- ⇒ Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder (OCD), characterized by repetitive, intrusive, irrational and unwanted thoughts (obsessions), rituals or actions that seem impossible to control (compulsions). Some people experience specific compulsions like, counting, arranging and cleaning.
- ⇒ Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), when someone experiences or witnesses a traumatic event like abuse, natural disaster or extreme violence experience symptoms like nightmares, flashbacks, feelings of being easily startled or afraid. Symptoms can last for months after the event and can make it difficult for a person to sustain loving relationships, work or return to "normal" routines.
- ⇒ **Phobias**, a disabling and irrational fear of something that actually poses little or no danger for most people. Phobias cause extreme [™]feelings of terror, dread and panic.

Reminder! Annual Tuberculosis Screening

All WCGRH employees must complete the Georgia State Hospital Employee Health Screening Form during the month of their birthday

TB screening is required during each employee's Birthday month

Tuberculosis screening is conducted in Nursing Services, Building 1, Room 25

Skin Tests are given on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday

Please follow these guidelines for completing the Annual Employee Health Screening:

- If you have the skin test performed off campus, you still must return the results to Nursing Services and complete the Employee Health Screening Form.
- If you have another job also requiring PPD Testing, we will provide you with a copy of your results.
 - If you have had a positive skin test in the past, you are still required to complete the Employee Health Screening Form.

Please Note: If Annual Tuberculosis is not completed within your birth month,

Employee cannot work until the screening is completed.
