West Central Georgia Regional Hospital (WCGRH) is located in Columbus, Georgia and provides inpatient services to consumers across Georgia.

WCGRH has inpatient treatment units for adult mental health and secure long-term care. The hospital can serve 146 secure (forensic) and 40 adult mental health (civil) patients (186 total beds) at any time. In fiscal year 2014, the hospital served a total of 412 individuals. The hospital employs approximately 624 staff.

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
