Tidbits of ECRH History

Thankfully, in the 1950's, new drugs and therapies were being developed to aid in the treatment of mental illness. To help in the development and use of these new tools, the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), in 1963, made funds available to each of the fifty states to develop a comprehensive State Plan for Mental Health.

Georgia quickly went to work by hiring Dr. Addison Duvall in March 1963, as its first State Mental Health Director for the Georgia Department of Public Health. Under his direction, A COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH PLAN FOR GEORGIA was produced in 1965. Among many other items, the PLAN called for construction of GEORGIA REGIONAL HOSPITAL AT AUGUSTA.....now ECRH's AUGUSTA CAMPUS.

Happy Healthy Birthday!

All employees are required to have an annual health screening, which includes the TB screening/assessment. ECRH uses employees' birth dates as their respective annual due dates. This screening is required for compliance with the Joint Commission standard HR .01.02.05, as well as for compliance with State regulations. Compliance with this health standard is a condition of continued employment. Employees cannot work if they are not in compliance. Those who are not in compliance will be assigned a Leave Without Pay Status (LWOP) until their TB screening/assessment is complete.



Other Employment, #22-1203

POLICY

A DBHDD employee who receives funds as a result of employment related activity outside of the DBHDD position is subject to the provisions of this policy.

Examples of activities that are considered other employment include, but are not limited to:

1. Contracting to provide services for a fee;
2. Serving as a consultant for a fee or honorarium;
3. Employment by an outside organization;
4. Self-employment providing services to the general public.

A DBHDD employee seeking other employment must complete and submit the *REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF OTHER EMPLOYMENT* Form to the supervisor prior to employment. Employees are **not** to begin other employment **prior** to receiving written approval from the supervisor and authorizing official, or designee.

The supervisor is to review the request to ensure that the other employment does not conflict with the employee's current duties and responsibilities or provide the potential for improper decisions in departmental activities. In addition, the supervisor is to ensure that the other employment does not present an actual or perceived conflict of interest. If determined appropriate, the supervisor is to approve the request and forward it to the designated authorizing official for review and approval.

Employees who do not have Internet access should contact their supervisor or human resource/ personnel representative for printed copies of this policy.

Help Prevent Theft and Other Crimes

- ◆ Keep your cell phone, purse, wallet, keys, or other valuable items with you at all times, or locked in secure place.




- ◆ Challenge all persons who appear to be out of place or suspicious. This can be accomplished by simply asking, "May I help you?" Do not rely on a hospital uniform, such as scrubs, to identify someone as an employee. Instead, ask for their ECRH identification badge. If further assistance is required, call Hospital Security.

- ◆ Make sure to close and lock doors and windows if you are the last to leave.
- ◆ Secure all valuable equipment such as electronic items, computers or printers.
- ◆ Report any broken or flickering lights, dimly lit corridors, doors that don't lock properly, or broken windows to Plant Operations. Don't wait for someone else to do it.
- ◆ Practice responsible key control. Do not keep a spare master key in an accessible place for the convenience of staff who might lock themselves out of their office.
- ◆ Record serial numbers of valuables, especially electronic items such as televisions, etc.
- ◆ Immediately report any suspicious activity to Hospital Security.

National Nutrition Month

March is National Nutrition Month®.

There is a nutrition education and information campaign sponsored annually by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, formerly The American Dietetic Association. The campaign is designed to focus attention on the importance of making informed food choices and developing sound eating and physical activity habits. National Nutrition Month (NNM) also promotes the Academy and its members to the public and the media as the most valuable and credible source of timely, scientifically based, food and nutrition information. Since 2007, the second Wednesday in March has marked Registered Dietitian-Nutritionist Day to recognize and celebrate the work they do as the designated providers under federal law of medical nutrition therapy. To practice in Georgia, as well as other states, the RD or RDN must also be licensed (LD). All registered dietitians are nutritionists – but not all nutritionists are registered dietitians. The majority work in the treatment and prevention of diseases as part of medical teams, often in hospitals, public health clinics, and nursing homes. Other areas you will find their expertise is in various community settings, such as in schools, fitness centers, sports nutrition corporate wellness, food management, and in private practice. The East Central Regional Hospital nutritionists are: Cheryl Bragg, TeAndrea Dallas, Aaron Newberry, and Keith Ward.



The National Nutrition Month theme for 2014 is **Enjoy the Taste of Eating Right**. Keep watch in the cafeterias during March for nutrition tidbits. Did you know that a 20 oz. bottle of regular soda contains 16 teaspoons of sugar, which is ¼ cup of sugar, 256 calories, and zero nutritional value?

Pharmacy Update

Controlled Drugs

Nursing:

1. Please return all **Percocet, Lortab, Lorcet, and Tylenol # 3** from all Nursing Units that do not have current orders for the medications. Please also return all other controlled substances that are not currently prescribed (unless the medication is one that is routinely ordered by the Dental Clinic for Pre-dental Sedation such as Valium).
2. The only Nursing Units that should stock **Percocet, Lortab, Lorcet, and Tylenol # 3** without current orders are 76-2 (After Hours Cabinet Stock) on the Gracewood Campus and EATO on the Augusta Campus.
3. **Please do not use tape on any unit dose packaging for any medications for any reason.** Any packaging found with tape attached to it should be brought to the immediate attention of the Nurse Supervisor. The Nurse Supervisor should inspect the medications and then notify the Pharmacy Director or Pharmacist in Charge. The medications should then be returned to the Pharmacy. If replacement medications are needed, the Nurse should complete a new floor stock request through the Online Floor Stock Ordering System.
4. **The Pharmacy will no longer dispense a quantity greater than 10 tablets for Percocet, Lortab, Lorcet, or Tylenol # 3 Floor Stock orders** unless the Physician's order is written for a routine schedule (not PRN). Any quantities dispensed greater than 10 tablets will be at the discretion of the Pharmacist in Charge.
5. Any area that has a new order entered by the Physician or Dentist for **Percocet, Lortab, Lorcet, or Tylenol # 3** may sign out **one dose at a time** from EATO or 76-2 until the Pharmacy opens and the nurse is able to enter a floor stock request for the medication. The Pharmacy will dispense **no more than 10 tablets** of a codeine derivative medication at one time (with the only possible exception being the floor stock supply for EATO or 76-2 AHC).



Attention Nursing Staff



Please make sure that all bags removed from the After Hours Cabinet are labeled with the Individual's Identification information.

This is essential for the proper charging and crediting of the medication. The bags should then be **sent back promptly** after the Pharmacy re-opens. If the bags are held on the unit and the Individual is discharged, the Pharmacy may not be able to credit the medications due to the Individual's information no longer being available in the computer system. Your assistance with this issue will be greatly appreciated.

Helpdesk covers items that were previously working and are not working or not working properly. Always keep ticket number and the name of the person you speak with for necessary follow up. **NOTE: Broken Mice & Keyboards** are replaced by helpdesk. Please keep info and report any issues with this process to Service Delivery Staff. Desktop printer issues may be phoned into Service Delivery at **2444** but will not be serviced. Replacement or alternative printing options will be reviewed.

Phone issues: Contact Switchboard at **2011** or e-mail **Tomica Willingham** (Use this number for repairs, problems, requesting new lines or jacks) Include the following: Telephone # with trouble, Building #, Type of phone (name on the phone), Room #, Station # if phone has one, problem with phone, & contact person. Always request 2x2 when having new voice (phone) & data (LAN) jacks added.
